Item 1: Introduction

RED REEF ADVISORS LLC is an SEC-registered investment adviser offering advisory accounts and services. Brokerage and investment advisory services and fees differ, and it is important that you understand the differences. This document gives you a summary of the types of services and fees we offer. Item 2: Relationships and Services

What investment services and advice can you provide me? Our firm primarily offers the following investment advisory services to retail clients: portfolio management (we review your portfolio, investment strategy, and investments); financial planning (we assess your financial situation and provide advice to meet your goals); solicitor/selection of other advisers (we select a third party adviser for you to use). All client accounts for which Red Reef Advisors' advisory services are provided on an ongoing basis are reviewed at least annually by the assigned advisor(s). Our firm offers both discretionary advisory services (where our firm makes the decision regarding the purchase or sale of investments) as well as non-discretionary services (where the retail investor makes the ultimate decision). We do not limit the types of investments that we recommend. We may also select outside Advisers or Managers to fill a specific investment mandate, if we deem it appropriate and in the best interests of the client. Our minimum account size is \$500,000. Please also see our Form ADV Part 2A ("[Brochure](#)"), specifically Items 4 & 7.

Questions to ask us: Given my financial situation, should I choose an investment advisory service? Why or why not? How will you choose investments to recommend to me? What is your relevant experience, including your licenses, education and other qualifications? What do these qualifications mean?

Item 3: Fees, Costs, Conflicts, and Standard of Conduct

What fees will I pay? Our fees vary depending on the services you receive. Additionally, the amount of assets in your account affects our advisory fee; the more assets you have in your advisory account, the more you will pay us and thus we have an incentive to increase those assets in order to increase our fee. For hourly fee arrangements, each additional hour (or portion thereof) we spend working for you would increase the advisory fee. Our fixed fee arrangements are based on the amount of work we expect to perform for you, so material changes in that amount of work will affect the advisory fee we quote you. Asset Management services are charged up to a maximum of 2% of assets under management, billed in arrears on a monthly or quarterly basis. The fee is calculated based on the market value of the account as of the last business day at the end of the quarter as reported by the custodian of each account and may vary due to trailing dividends and/or settling trades. In addition, Red Reef Advisors may enter into an engagement with a client to charge a fixed fee for financial planning. Fees are determined on a case by case basis, based upon the level of expertise and sophistication to deliver such a plan. In addition, Red Reef Advisors may negotiate hourly fee for these services. Fees are charged with nominal down payment and full payment due upon completion. You pay our fees even if you do not have any transactions and the advisory fee paid to us generally does not vary based on the type of investments selected. Some investments (e.g., mutual funds, variable annuities, etc.) impose additional fees (e.g., transactional fees and product-level fees) that reduce the value of your investment over time. The same goes for any additional fees you pay to a custodian or outside Adviser or Manager. Additionally, you will pay transaction fees, if applicable, when we buy or sell an investment for your account. We do not charge a separate fee nor will we share in any fees paid directly to any custodians or outside Advisers or Managers selected by us.

You will pay fees and costs whether you make or lose money on your investments. Fees and costs will reduce any amount of money you make on your investments over time. Please make sure you understand what fees and costs you are paying. Please also see our [Brochure](#) for additional details.

Questions to ask us: Help me understand how these fees and costs might affect my investments. If I give you \$10,000 to invest, how much will go to fees and costs, and how much will be invested for me?

What are your legal obligations to me when acting as my investment adviser? How else does your firm make money and what conflicts of interest do you have? When we act as your investment adviser, we have to act in your best interest and not put our interest ahead of yours. At the same time, the way we make money creates some conflicts with your interests. You should understand and ask us about these conflicts because they can affect the investment advice we provide you.

Here are some examples to help you understand what this means:

- For AUM fees, the more assets you have in your advisory account, the more you will pay us and thus we have an incentive to increase those assets in order to increase our fee.
- For hourly fees, each additional hour we spend working for you would increase the advisory fee and thus we have an incentive for you to agree to have us complete more work for you.
- For fixed fees, the more work we expect to perform for you, the higher our fee would be and thus we have an incentive for you to agree to have us complete more work for you.

Questions to ask us: How might your conflicts of interest affect me, and how will you address them?

How do your financial professionals make money? Primarily, we and our financial professionals receive cash compensation from the advisory services we provide to you because of the advisory fees we receive from you. This compensation may vary based on different factors, such as those listed above in this Item. Please also see Item 10 of our [Brochure](#) for additional details.
